



The Industrial Advisory Board Presents.....

An Innovative Method for Converting Polyethylene Plastics Wastes into Liquid Fuel

"In India researchers have developed a relatively low-temperature process to convert postconsumer plastics bags and packaging into commercially viable liquid fuel."

Although plastics in various forms such as solids, films and foams are an essential part of daily life of people, post-consumer wastes have been posing some problems in most countries. Polyethylene with main grades as low-density, medium-density, high-density and liquids belong to the Olefins family of plastics, with low-density polyethylene probably being the most popular.

Over the years, due to rapid global population growth, as more and more plastics are consumed, the generations of plastics wastes have escalated. Among this waste is the common plastics polymer polyethylene which is used to make many products such as: containers, medical and laboratory equipment, computer components and many others, with a very large volume as plastic films converted into packaging and bags. Recycling initiatives have been in place in many parts of the world for some time now but much of these wastes have ended up in landfills, dispersed in the environment or in the sea. Polymer manufacturers have experimented with bio-degradable additives but it is a losing battle so far.

Several chemists and research scientists have been working to develop a commercially viable technology for efficiently converting low-density polyethylene (LDPE) into a liquid fuel. Given that most plastics are made from petrochemical feed stocks, this solution involving plastics recycling brings the life-cycle full circle, allowing a second use of this material as a substitute for oil. This process, when implemented on a large enough scale, will reduce pressures on landfills as well as ameliorating the effects of dwindling oil resources in a world with increasing demand on petrochemicals for fuel.

One of the most successful methodologies developed so far uses a thermo-chemical process based on *pyrolysis*. This is a heating process, where the plastics wastes are heated to between 400 and 500 Celsius with a kaolin catalyst. This causes the plastic's material long polymer chain to break apart in a process called *thermo-catalytic degradation*. This releases large quantities of much smaller carbon-rich molecules. To identify these molecules, analytical techniques such as gas chromatography coupled with mass spectrometry can be effectively used. In actual practice, it has been found that these molecule's components of their liquid fuel to be mainly paraffin's and olefins with chains 10 to16 carbon atoms long. Chemically, this makes this liquid fuel very similar to conventional petrochemical fuels.

The catalyst used in this method-kaolin- is a clay mineral containing aluminum and silicon. It functions as a catalyst by providing a large reactive surface on which the polymer molecules can sit and so be exposed to high temperatures inside the batch reactor, which breaks them apart. At 450 degrees Celsius with low percentage of kaolin, liquid production would be around 70% with by-products being combustible gases and wax. In other words, for every kilogram of plastics wastes, the process will yield around 700 grams of liquid fuel. This fuel yield could be boosted to almost 80% with minimized reactive times but would require a lot more catalyst like 1 kg. Kaolin for every 2 kg. Plastics waste.

This technology may be of special interest to Sri Lanka where the production or use of polythene film less than 20 microns is banned especially for products like bags and packaging. Based on this technology and extending this thermo-chemical process to a combination of pyrolysis and gasification/liquefying method, most plastics wastes could yield commercially viable liquid fuels.



Remembering the Voice of Arjuna,

'How to get anything you want in Life


